Fire Extinguisher Protocols

Each student will learn how to operate a Class ABC dry chemical extinguisher to effectively extinguish a Class B fire.

OSFM Mobilization Reimbursement

This presentation will cover the Oregon Office of State Fire Marshal's role in incident response, the Oregon Fire Service Mobilization Plan, and the mobilization reimbursement process. The presentation will also provide attendees with a look at some of the lessons learned in regards to reimbursement and response through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact during the unprecedented 2017 fire season.

Little City, Big Problem – I-5 Bridge Collapse

Roy Hari is the Fire Chief for the Aumsville Fire District. He is retired from both Oregon and Washington where he served as Fire Chief for the City of Mount Vernon and Skagit County Fire District 1 (9 years) and as Fire Chief for Marion County Fire District 1 for 7 years, including 28 years as a Firefighter/Paramedic. Chief Hari will present a program on the role of non-traditional personnel such as Office Administrators and support staff in the face of large-scale events.

Sexual Harassment

Given recent events regarding sexual harassment and inappropriate behavior, SDAO's Assistant General Counsel Spencer Rockwell has teamed up with Risk Management Consultant Jason Jantzi to teach you how to spot sexual harassment in the workplace. This presentation will include simple identification techniques, legal standards (in plain language), and role playing - as well as advice for what to do when you've determined that sexual harassment may be occurring in your district.

Public Records Law – 2018 Update (will include other emerging topics)

SDAO staff will discuss the impacts of SB 481, which among other things, sets time requirements that public bodies must meet when responding to requests for public records and specifies the process for responding.

The Artful Science of Effective Communication

Communication is the act of transferring information from one person to another. We are able to communicate verbally, in writing, visually, and non-verbally—how well we communicate (both giving and receiving information) is fundamental in our personal and professional lives. Communication is a crucial part of who we are and how we interact with our world. This session will offer you an opportunity to improve your own communication style and develop an understanding of the best way to truly hear as well as be heard.

Oregon Fossil Guy

*Oregon resident and avocational paleontologist, Guy DiTorrice (aka "Oregon Fossil Guy"), presents "**Fossil Hide-&Seek on the Oregon Coast**" or "**You'll Never Walk on the Beach the Same Again**". This multi-media presentation provides an 'edutaining' overview of the various 10-20 million-year-old fossils found in the gravel and cobble piles below sea cliffs and on sandy beaches along Oregon's rugged coastline. In addition to this 'edutaining' presentation, DiTorrice is integrating visuals and commentary regarding his time as a volunteer firefighter/EMT, captain and public information officer with Newport Fire & Rescue where beach fossil collecting was 'interrupted' by fire-rescue calls and vice-versa.*
